

What is Amendment 2 to the Missouri Constitution?

Prior to 2018, Missouri had not legalized the use or possession of medical marijuana. Amendment 2, which was approved by Missouri voters in November 2018, legalized marijuana for medical purposes. The ballot initiative allows state-licensed physicians to recommend marijuana use to patients with nine qualifying conditions and additional conditions with a doctor's approval. Patients will be allowed to grow six flowering plants in their homes, purchase four ounces of dried marijuana or equivalent, and possess not more than a 90-day supply of dried marijuana or equivalent. Amendment 2 also allows for a tax to be levied on the sale of medical marijuana at four percent, and will allocate revenue from the tax toward providing healthcare services, job training, housing assistance, and other services to veterans. Amendment 2 tasked the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services with overseeing and regulating the state's medical marijuana program.
